## Countable and Uncountable Nouns



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# Do you remember what a noun is? 

A noun is..............
a person
a place
a 'thing'

## Some nouns are countable and some nouns are uncountable.

## Countable nouns

Countable nouns are the nouns we can count.

If there is only one (singular noun) we use a or an in front of it.
e.g. a lemon, an apple

If there is more than one (plural noun) we usually add -s to the noun.
e.g. apples, lemons

If we want to ask about the quantity of a countable noun we use the phrase, how many?
e.g. How many apples do you want?

## Uncountable nouns

Uncountable nouns are nouns we cannot or do not count.

They are always in the singular form so we never use a or an with them.

However, we can use quantity words with them. e.g. a bag of, a cup of....

If we want to talk about quantity we use the phrase how much
e.g. How much sugar do you want in your tea?


## NOTE

Some nouns can be countable or uncountable.

This depends on if we are talking about a specific item or in general.
e.g. Let's buy two peppers (countable) Let's buy peppers. (uncountable)
