What is conference?

Conference its the most general term to indicate a meeting for discussion – most commonly adopted by associations and organizations for their regular meetings.

The most traditional type of presentation at the conference is a paper followed by questions.

WORKSHOP, a brief intensive educational program for a small group of people that focuses on techniques and skills in a particular field.
